Welcome to the Autumn 2017 edition of the Martin Grant Homes Company Newsletter.

After a busy first quarter and early Spring, the 'snap' general election certainly stalled our sales activity in May and June. This was not unexpected given the political uncertainty and the negative effect this has on business and consumer confidence. However, July was a very positive month for us, boosted by the excellent new product releases at Penrose Park (Biggleswade Site 3) and at Buckton Fields (Parcel 2), and also the formal launch of our developments at Summerswood in Ifield and Maple Fields in Alton.

The 2017 outlook remains positive and we are on track to meet our new home delivery targets for the year and also start five new developments at West End in Woking, Stansted Mountfitchet, Aylesbury (Area HM06), Bramley and Birdham this year to secure delivery in 2018 and beyond.

The period since our last Company Newsletter has also been very productive for our Land Team and included the successful completion of a prime development opportunity in Stansted Mountfitchet and further works to secure new opportunities in Bedfordshire and Oxfordshire.

Show Home Opening at Summerswood Ifield



We opened the doors to our new show home at ‘Summerswood’ in Ifield on Saturday 29th July and the feedback we have had so far has been very positive. ‘Summerswood’ is our new development of homes in the village of Ifield in West Sussex, comprising of 27 private units and 9 HA apartments. It includes 3, 4 and 5 bedroom homes and is set back from the road leading out of the village of Ifield to the west. Whilst the idyllic landscape of West Sussex is on the doorstep, Ifield station is less than a ten minute walk from the development, offering our buyers easy access into Central London and we have discovered that the area is a popular destination for families, locals, and also for those moving out of the capital.

The specification of the homes at ‘Summerswood’ is excellent, with Karndean Knight flooring, LED lighting and contemporary integrated appliances as standard plus little extras such as outside taps and TV points for Sky Plus.

Andrew Henry, the interior designer behind the new Show Home, comments: “We had a buyer in mind when designing the Show Home at ‘Summerswood’ and were inspired by a modern family, upsizing to a new dream home to enjoy more space and the West Sussex lifestyle. The interiors scheme will appeal to discerning buyers who put a premium on style, whilst nonetheless including all the trappings of a family home, including

children’s bedrooms.”

Chris Hamilton comments on the scheme: “‘Summerswood’ is appealing to both buyers from the local area who are keen to upsize to a contemporary home, and those moving out of the capital. Buyers will be impressed by the homes’ value for money whilst also offering a very easy and fast commute into Central London. We Catch up with Construction at Summerswood



We caught up with Joe Beard, our Site Manager at Summerswood and asked him how construction was going since the site started, here's what he had to say...



How is the build progressing?

Building has been difficult due to the close proximity of houses to each other and how the scaffolds tie in and interlink but we are progressing well and all the trades are communicating which is good.

What challenges have you faced since site started?

I wasn't here at the start, however I have picked up the build with the help of Gary Noble who has now moved on to Send. One of the challenges is the complexity of some of the internal details, like the roofs, main roof to side roof and linking to porch, all causing various visits for trades.



What Sub-Contractors have you got working on site at the moment?

The subbies we have on site currently are Norman Group, the bricklayers and scaffolders, plus SC Drylining, who have worked with us previously at our Fairfield Green development in Horley. The newbies are GJB Windows and Harrisons Electrical. Commodore Kitchens, Bracknell Roofing and R&P Carpentry are also Sub-Contractors that we have previously used and come back to.

Has the site been well-received by the locals in the area?

Initially I don't think the locals wanted the development however keeping the neighbours in the loop and trying to calm tensions on issues does always help. We are starting to build good relationships now with the local community and people are pleased to see the houses now taking shape.

How long will the site be under construction?

The aim is to be off site next April, however some issues like the roofs were not foreseen and have taken longer to sort out than we expected.

When do you expect the first completions?

The Show Home has been open some weeks now and we expect approximately one a week now until Christmas.

Strategic Land Update

Cokerhurst Farm, Wembdon, Bridgwater Update

This site remains in the draft Local Plan as an allocated site and, although we are working beside Persimmon Homes, who control land to the south of Quantock Road, we expect to prepare an outline Planning Application with our partners, Cavanna Homes Ltd, for about 700 houses in the new year following the examination in public into the proposed Local Plan. There will be a comprehensive Masterplan for the overall site which will amount to over 1200 houses but our Planning Application will follow the approximate boundary of the red line in the previous allocation.



Hampton Green, Northampton Update

Our proposal to submit an outline planning application with Harcourt Developments for 525 houses was issued to the Landowners for approval a few weeks ago. This has been subject to a number of points raised by the Landowners which we have answered and we expect to be able to submit the planning application shortly.



Walpole Farm, Stansted Mountfitchet Update

At long last, we have now completed the purchase of this land jointly with our partners, Bloor Homes. The site benefits from an outline planning permission for 160 houses/flats, commercial B1 unit, allotments and a primary school. The reserved matters approval is for 147 houses and we have benefited from an extra unit with our half share. Although the planning application was implemented some time ago, we have now properly commenced development.



Village 1, Milton Keynes, Hayfield Update

The proposed Planning Application for 600-650 units will be submitted jointly with our partners, Miller Homes, Taylor Wimpey and Harcourt Developments. It has now been completed and is with the relevant Landowners for approval prior to submission.

Immediate Land Update

Iron Age Settlement Found at Our New Site at Benner Lane, Woking



We were recently featured on 'Get Surrey' online where the article detailed the archaeological findings at our new site in Benner Lane, West End, Woking...

"Archaeologists working near West End have found evidence of an Iron Age settlement on the site of a new housing development. The dig at Malthouse Farm in Benner Lane has so far turned up the remains of two roundhouses, a granary and pieces of pottery thought to date from around 500BC.

The finds are believed to be the first evidence of Iron Age activity in West End, although settlements from that period have previously been found at Bagshot and the Arboretum at Windlesham. Along with the Iron Age finds, archaeologists have also unearthed evidence of a Bronze Age pit, suggesting people may have lived in West End for up to 5,000 years.

The excavation is taking place prior to the construction of 95 houses."

Construction has now started at the development which will be called The Maltings. The roads providing access into the site will be finalised at the end of August and sales will launch from early October.

Steventon Road, East Hanney, Oxfordshire Update

This site has outline Planning Permission for 40 houses / flats but we have a contract conditional upon two issues. We have made good progress on both of them and although the conditional contract has been extended until late September, we expect all issues to be resolved by then and completion of the purchase to take place later in the year.

Tell us a bit about yourself and your new role...

So far this year we have been very busy with the children achieving milestones in their lives, going out to various places such as Hampton Court, to the cinema and bauble blowing! Below are just a highlight of some of these...

Happy Circus came to Cherry Trees on Saturday July 22nd July for a fun day for some 200 people. The Deputy Mayor of Guildford opened the event, welcoming families to come and join in the fun with free face painting, fete games, cycling, Sumo wrestling, performance cars and dancing before the amazing Circus Show. Many of the families had never been to a Circus together or even been able to get their child to have their face painted and were so grateful for their whole family to enjoy such a great time together. Everyone that attended either had a child with special needs or were a sibling or friend/supporter of Cherry Trees so there was no pressure when their children got up and walked around during the show or shouted and sung when everyone else was quiet.



I love popping over to the house to see what's going on, who is in and what they are up to and as always there is plenty! Last week I was chatting with some of the care team and one of our boys came out of his room with sleepy eyes and ruffled hair, having just woken up. It was 10am and it filled my heart with joy to see a young lad being able to have a lay in as it was the summer holidays. Many care homes are very rigid with routines such as times to get up or go to bed, however what makes Cherry Trees special is that we treat each child individually and have a flexible approach, especially during holiday periods – just like the children would have at home. After a short while this young man was asked if he wanted breakfast and off he sauntered with his carer to get the breakfast he requested. Little things like that make such a big difference.

We are now in the busiest period of the year, as parents have their children home 24 hours a day and are in need of short breaks in order to cope. Our care team have created a great programme of events over the summer which allows the children to get out and about but also to relax with their friends – like we all love to! There has been visits to Birdworld, to the cinema,

joining Sean's amazing birthday party and the children also came out and supported our riders in the Pru 100.

We also had a visit from Bezerkaz Circus recently. What a fun afternoon for the children, interacting with the two performers and playing with massive coloured bubbles. The children were running through the bubbles chasing them around the garden. Staff were spinning plates, it was a delight to watch.

Honestly we do get some work done here in the fundraising office, but seeing all these things going on makes the job easier as we can see on a daily basis the impact our work at Cherry Trees is making.
